HOLOCAUST HISTORIOGRAPHY -- SOME REFLECTIONS

Holocaust historiography is a vast and complex body of scholarly literature.

In this lecture, Dan Stone, author of *Histories of the Holocaust* (2010) and editor of *The Historiography of Genocide* (2008), will provide some ways of making sense of this complexity. Focusing on several key areas of recent historical research – plunder, perpetrator research, race theory and comparative genocide studies – Stone will assess the current state of Holocaust scholarship and offer suggestions for future research.

Dan Stone is Professor of Modern History at Royal Holloway, University of London.

The author or editor of a dozen books and more than sixty scholarly articles, his publications include *Responses to Nazism in Britain 1933–1939: Before War and Holocaust* (2002, 2nd edition 2012); *The Oxford Handbook of Postwar European History* (May 2012) and *The Holocaust and Historical Methodology* (ed., July 2012). He is one of the editors of the *Journal of Genocide Research* and an associate editor of *Patterns of Prejudice*. He is currently writing a book on postwar Europe for Oxford University Press.
